#### APPLICATION FOR DESIGNATION OF NEIGHBOURHOOD AREA

Pitstone Panish Council has resolved to develop a Neighbourhood Plan for the panish of Pitstone and accordingly we are writing to apply for the designation of the parish as a neighbourhood area under Regulation 5 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012.

Regulation 5 requires a relevant body submitting an area application to the local planning authority to include:

- (a) A map which identifies the area to which the application relates
- (b) A statement explaining why this area is considered appropriate to be designated
- (c) A statement that the body making the application is a relevant body for the purposes of section 61G of the 1990 Act

Attached is a map of the current panish boundary and this will be the area to which this application relates. The area covered by this application will be the whole of the parish and will not intrude into any of the adjoining parishes.

The Localism Act 2011 makes it clear in section 61F that a parish council is authorised to act in relation to a neighbourhood area if that area consists of or includes the whole or part of any area of the council. Pitstone Parish Council is a constituted parish council and is an integral part of the local government of the area. The Parish Council wishes to implement a neighbourhood plan for the parish as has been agreed and minuted at a meeting of the Parish Council held on 21 August 2014 and this application for the designation of the parish as a neighbourhood area is the first stage of that process. As a parish it is completely appropriate to be so designated

Section 61G of the 1990 Act, as amended by the Localism Act of 2011, states in paragraph (2) that a relevant body means a parish or town council. Thus Pitstone Parish Council is a relevant body under section 61G of the 1990 Act.

Please acknowledge receipt of this application and indicate a timescale for the publicising of this application and the decision to accept or reject.

The main topic of importance over the last couple of months has been the proposed development in Station Road Ivinghoe, by speculative developers, Gladman. This has been a wake up call for both villages and as a result Pitstone Parish Council is going to develop its own neighbourhood plan (see opposite). This involves setting up a steering committee outside of, but answerable to, the Parish Council. In so doing taking control of where we should like development to take place and not have it thrown at us from a speculative developer.

This steering committee will possibly have the ability to work in separate groups associated with the needs of the village and this may include close co-operation and communication with lvinghoe Parish Council, in areas that concern both villages e.g. transport, church, school, surgeries etc. In doing this we feel that it is the best possible way for us to have a say in what happens, in terms of development, to our village. It is going to happen and we want to be in control.

The whole Parish has had a leaflet drop and we have had a dozen or more volunteers come forward to assist with this task. We wish them well. You will all be kept informed of progress. Winter well.

#### Planning decisions

AVDC aimed to reach a decision on the proposed 70 houses at Station Road Ivinghoe by October 8, but as I understand it no decision is likely before the end of the month. When the decision has been made I and my fellow councillor for Cheddington ward Corry Cashman, will let people know through a short newsletter on planning.

The District Council elections May 2015 will be held on new boundaries, decided by the Boundary Commission, despite representation and alternative suggestions from the Council and local people.

The current separate Pitstone and Cheddington wards will be combined into a single 'Pitstone and Cheddington' ward with two District Councillors. The new ward will include Pitstone, Cheddington, Ivinghoe, and Marsworth, but not Ivinghoe Aston or Slapton.

The General Election May 2015. If our MP John Bercow, Speaker of the House of Commons, stands again for election, as anticipated, it is highly likely that he will once again not be opposed by the three main political parties. (As speaker, he is not a member of any political party). Last time many voters were disappointed when they only discovered this on polling day. It is a longstanding convention that in respect for the office, the main parties do not oppose the speaker. Local Lib Dems have been lobbying the national party ever since our MP became the speaker, to ignore the convention and give voters a choice, so far without SUCCESS.

County Council Children's Services were judged inadequate by Ofsted this summer, particularly around social work practices. However processes for children who go missing or who are at risk from sexual exploitation were identified as strong, thankfully. In recent weeks a robust improvement plan has been drawn up and the council committed to additional funding, so far £4M overspend this year, £1M from contingency, plus another £4M still needed. The Ofsted report opened with the statement that Children's Social care is not in the two top priorities for the Council, limiting the effectiveness of those with lead responsibility for the service. I hope this hard hitting report is an opportunity to change that.

At last - £263M capital investment in Bucks roads for a four year 'preventative asset maintenance' programme. This is a stunning U turn from a council leader who has consistently rubbished my annual budget speech for the last three years which has emphasised the absolute necessity for investment. The new cabinet member for Transportation, Ruth Vigor-Hedderley has successfully reorganised the delivery of highway repairs and gained additional revenue funding, the

results of which can be seen in the spate of local roadworks.

#### National Heritage - Risky Business

The AVDC Heritage Team will soon be embarking upon a comprehensive Grade II Listed Building Survey across the District, as part of the National Heritage at Risk Grade II Project.

The aim of the project is to train local volunteers to survey important historic buildings in their area, and to monitor those buildings to make sure that they are not falling into disrepair.

#### Yardley Avenue Bollards

Many residents have enquired about these bollards. They were installed by the Vale of Aylesbury Housing Trust (VAHT) who own the land, following a request for assistance from Thames Valley Police to prevent parking on the grass apron which had continued to cause difficulties for those exiting the junction. Bucks County Council Transport for Bucks (TfB) had approved bollards to be installed in this location. Unfortunately, the type of bollard chosen by VAHT did not comply with the Highway Regulations laid down by TfB who then insisted that they be removed immediately. VAHT has now sourced additional funding and re-installed approved bollard w/c 29 September 2014 and our thanks go to them for doing so.

#### Highway Works

Both Cheddington Road and Glebe Close are due to receive extensive patching and repair as part of Transport for Bucks Severe Weather program of works. The former should be complete in October (road closure will be in place) and then the white lines will be renewed. Glebe Close should follow before Christmas.

#### Cycle Path along Northfield Road

Herts County Council has now received the funding contribution from Taylor Wimpey via Bucks County Council and are now making good progress on plans for the cycle path down to Tring station. There are still some hurdles to overcome, but they hope that it may be installed within the next 18 months – 2 years.

Unfortunately this has suffered a further delay. The majority of this initiative falls within the control of Marsworth Parish Council who had hoped to submit a bid for New Homes Bonus funding in September 2014, but this did not occur. They now hope to prepare a bid for the next round of funding in September 2015. In the meantime, Pitstone Parish Council is looking to see if there are alternative ways to get the Pitstone stretch of this footpath installed, which will run from Westfield Road up to the railway bridge.

Beautification of the Marsworth Road roundabout and the village – would you like to get involved?

Following feedback from residents as part of the Love It, Loath It survey and the Leisure Survey carried out over the last few years, the parish council has been working with Bucks County Council Transport for Bucks (TfB) to gain agreement to visually improve the roundabout. This process has been frustratingly slow.

Once again, TfB has declined permission for their roundabout to be converted to enable shrubs/trees to be planted, however they are prepared to now discuss a horticultural licence which would permit us to manage a number of flowering planters on the roundabout and at other locations throughout the village, such as by the village gates and around the village sign.

This would be the second project as part of the plan to brighten up and enhance the village, the first having been the hundreds of daffodil bulbs planted along Marsworth Road which provide such a glorious display in the

If there was sufficient local interest, the parish could enter the *In Bloom* competition in the future. Alternatively, the Parish Council may run a more local competition with each container sponsored by a local community group or individual and prizes awarded for the winners; or even seek local commercial sponsorship from interested local firms. If you have any thoughts, or can spare a little time to get involved in the beautification scheme, please get in touch with the Parish Clerk.

Finally, whilst discussing the roundabout, TfB think that the central light and all the surrounding fixtures should be replaced before **Christmas. The main light didn't work at all** for 2 years and then for the last 2 years they have been unable to turn it off so it has been lit 24 hours a day! It has taken much effort over many years to get agreement for the works but we are told that the equipment is now at least in the warehouse and they are just waiting for available time to install it.

#### Castlemead

Taylor Wimpey (TW) has started to work with Bucks County Council to define and carry out all the remedial works required before BCC will consider adopting the highway along Westfield Road, the industrial estate and the residential areas. The highways then need to be maintained at adoptable standard by TW for 12 months before BCC will accept the transfer.

The areas of open space will transfer to Aylesbury Vale District Council (apart from the two play areas which are already owned by the parish council). Phases I and II have already transferred and Phase III is in the process. The other phases will follow.

The parish council has been working with Royal Mail to hopefully obtain a letter box along Windsor Road. Historically, Royal Mail has declined to consider an additional box, however they are now reviewing the position for Castlemead and we hope to be able to secure one before Christmas.

# Defibrillator at Yardley Avenue Surgery

It takes an ambulance between 15 and 20 minutes to reach Pitstone when you make an emergency call. If you have suffered a sudden cardiac arrest, you have only 5 minutes to receive life-saving treatment. If you are lucky, one of our volunteer Community First Responders will be on duty & will rush to your aid. However, if they are not on duty, you will soon be able to access a life-saving defibrillator.

The parish council is extremely grateful to the Village Health Centre in Yardley Avenue who have agreed to purchase and externally mount a defibrillator at their site; and also to the Pitstone & Ivinghoe Junior Football Club, Envirologistics Football Club, Tring Town Football Club and Pitstone & Ivinghoe United Football Club who between them have funded the purchase of the necessary external lock-box.

You will all receive an invitation to come along to the hall to hear about the benefits of defibrillators and see just how easy it is to work one. The machine has voice prompts throughout and will not shock a patient who would not benefit from it, so there is no chance you could do any damage to the patient. Make sure you come along — you never know if it might be one of your family & friends that needs your urgent assistance.

#### Responsible Dog Ownership

Owning a dog can be hugely rewarding in numerous ways. However, we would like to encourage all residents to display responsible dog ownership when out with their pets. Please:

- keep dogs on leads when walking around the residential paths – not all our residents are dog lovers and other walkers may become distressed or worried by your dogs behaviour if it approaches them.
- clear up all dog fouling when you are away from home – it is an offence to allow your dog to foul the footpath or other public places like our recreation ground. Please bag all fouling whilst you are out walking and place it into one of the numerous dog bins or litter bins provided around the village.
- secure any fouling at home into bags and then dispose of in your green lid refuse bin.
- remember never to leave your dog in your vehicle, even for a short while, when it is hot.
- ensure your dog is micro-chipped –
  this is shortly to become compulsory,
  so please get in touch with your vet if
  you haven't already chipped your dog
  and this will also help you to be reunited should your pet become lost.

# **Dacorum Borough Council's Plans for** Tring

Dacorum Borough Council has launched a consultation into the development plans for Tring which include a site for approximately 200 houses plus 5 traveller pitches in West Tring, 2 x sites with an estimated capacity of approximately 25 homes and one site with 10 homes. The plans also include the foot/cycle path between Pitstone and Tring station. The report does not reveal how the impact on Tring secondary school capacity has been taken into consideration.
