

COUNTY COUNCIL NEWS

Avril Davies County Councillor, Ivinghoe Division

Many people have asked if I am finding more time since standing down from the District Council in May. There seemed to be no respite until August, when everything is quiet, but maybe now, this September, I won't miss the planning meetings that had become so frustrating and futile, trying to control development with every local policy shot away by government and their planning inspectorate. Apart from planning, the bulk of my Councillor's work load had always been on County, even before I was a County Councillor!

As well as Pitstone, this county division includes Ivinghoe, Ivinghoe Aston, Edlesborough, Northall Dagnall, Slapton, Cheddington, Mentmore and Marsworth. The County Council budget is 10 times that of the District, and apart from planning is responsible for all the

difficult services of: child protection, elderly social care, public health, education, roads, flood protection, waste and quarrying, with libraries, museums and archaeology added on for good measure!

I wrote most of this report in July to catch the deadline for the Ivinghoe Beacon. Since then very little has happened in the summer school holiday period, although work has continued on the child sexual exploitation enquiry, and on the flooding enquiry that I am part of. The highway maintenance teams have been hyperactive across the county, and progress has been made on the A4146 project.

Roads

On Wednesday, July 8th I gave the new cabinet member for transportation at Bucks County Council, a guided tour of the Ivinghoe Division. I pleaded with him

at Council, half in jest, for the whole of the £3M released from council reserves for highway maintenance, to be spent in Ivinghoe Division. As a new broom, his interest had been sparked by his meeting with Edlesborough, Northall and Dagnall campaign group, who wanted to downgrade the A4146 to a B road, and raised all the HGV routing issues that beset this corner of the County. The downgrade is being pursued by Hertfordshire county council, but the officers at Bucks, although sympathetic, are adamant that such a step must not divert traffic onto other roads, particularly the B488. There would be an opportunity, with the opening of the A505 link from Leighton Buzzard to the M1 - the Dunstable North bypass - but it would need co-ordinated signage and changing the designation of the Stoke Hammond Bypass from the A4146 to the A505. The three counties involved are working on this to see how it could be implemented. Preventing Child Sexual Exploitation I am participating, by special invitation from the chair of the Education, Skills and Children's Services Select Committee, in a review of this hot topic. 'R U Safe?' and 'RUWise2it?', are not services or campaign slogans operating in a vacuum. The police say that two out of three children, from pre-school age onwards, are

vulnerable to this, through social media and on-line games. The job of the select committee is to see if the Council is exploiting every possible course of action to protect children and young people. There are many opportunities on offer to learn about internet safety, so take them if you can. The recent Old Bailey trial of several men from the Aylesbury Area shows how hard it is to bring perpetrators to justice. The County Council and Thames Valley Police have been taking preventative action and working to get robust enough evidence to bring people to court, since at least 2005 when I requested a meeting about this because of some information I had been given. Ivinghoe Conservation Area I am elated and extremely relieved that the revised lyinghoe conservation area policy has passed all the hurdles, and been agreed at Aylesbury Vale District Council. This is an excellent piece of work, and if you are interested in the history of the village it is well worth investing in a copy. Ivinghoe was one of the first villages in Aylesbury Vale to be designated a conservation area because of its outstanding merits, but being an early prototype, did not benefit from the scholarship, architectural expertise and planning policies that informed later conservation areas. The revision was long overdue, and thanks are due to

Karen Groom, chairman of Ivinghoe Parish Council, who left nothing to chance, and attended the final decision making cabinet meeting to leave the Councillors in no doubt of the importance and value of the conservation area to residents. Dagnall School With the endorsement of parents and the community, Dagnall School has taken the innovative step to become a Church of England maintained school, in the diocese of

St Albans. I have been able to support this unusual step from the beginning, as the head teacher has been good enough to engage me from the early days, and reassure me that not only will the school continue to serve the whole community, but that its presence will be strengthened by being able to draw upon the resource of the diocese, and partner with other nearby schools such as Little Gaddesden



Two pieces of legislation come into force in October:

5p charge for single-use plastic carrier bags comes into effect in October

British shoppers took 8.5m single-use carrier bags from major supermarkets in 2014, an increase for the 5th year in a row. Plastic bags can take years to fully decompose and even though household recycling rates have improved significantly in recent years, 16,000 tonnes of waste still goes to landfill every year. Around 8m tonnes of plastic also ends up in our oceans each year, polluting the marine environment and harming precious sea life.

Rory Stewart, the Resource Minister, said "simple changes to our shopping routines, such as taking our own bags with us or using more bags for life, can make a huge difference in reducing the amount of plastic in circulation meaning we can all enjoy a cleaner, healthier country."

The introduction of a 5p charge for single-use carrier bags comes into effect in England in October following the success of similar schemes in Scotland and Wales. In Wales the charge led to a 79% decrease in plastic bags taken in the first three years, and in second, the number of 'bags for life' used, quadrupled.

Rory Stewart added "The charge will also boost our growing economy by delivering savings of £60m in litter clean-up costs and £13m in carbon savings. Good causes will also benefit from the charge and as much as £730m could be donated to charities and not-for-profit

organisations over 10 years".

We can all play our part, so next time you to pop into Masons or along to a supermarket, please remember to take your own bags. Smoking ban in cars carrying children comes into force in October

From October it will be illegal to smoke in a car, or other vehicle, with anyone under 18 present. The law is changing to protect children and young people from the dangers of Autumn 2015 second hand smoke.

Both the driver and the smoker could be fined £50. The law applies to every driver in England and Wales, including those aged 17 and those with a provisional license. The law does not apply if the driver is 17 years old and is alone in the car. Every time a child breathes in second hand smoke, they breathe in thousands of chemicals. This puts them at risk of serious conditions including meningitis, cancer, bronchitis

The law applies to any private vehicle that is enclosed wholly or partly by a roof. It still applies if people have the

If there is any proposed sale of the site (owned by AVDC), the Parish Council must be given an opportunity to bid for the land. Disappointingly AVDC have not accepted the application for the area of open parkland owned by Bucks County Council and managed by the Parish Council.

The Parish Council still intends to designate both sites as Local Green Space within our Neighbourhood Plan. Your support of the plan, to protect these parcels from development, would be much appreciated.







Road verges are one of the most important, best loved and frequently viewed habitatsin the country...

So why are they still being destroyed?



A new Plantlife study shows that Britain's road verges are home to 703 species of wild plants, more than in any other part of our landscape, and 87 of them are either threatened with extinction or heading that way. In addition, 88% of these wild plants provide nectar and pollen for bees and other insects, making road verges essential refuges for insect life; bird's-foot trefoil alone is a food plant for 132 species of insect.

In addition, 21 of the 25 Nation's Favourite Wildflowers grow on road verges. From cowslips and bluebells in spring to swathes of cow parsley and ox-eye daisies in early summer, our verges are home to most of the 25 favourite wild flowers as voted for by the public. And with 30 million drivers in the UK, they're the most frequently viewed habitat too, providing many people with their only regular daily contact with nature.

But in much of Britain road verges are still being needlessly cut down in full flower threatening the wildflowers and the wildlife that depend on them. Many councils have already started cutting verges - much too early in the year for flowers to be able to set seed, and greatly reducing one of the most important food banks for our ailing bees and other pollinators.

Dr Trevor Dines, Plantlife's Botanical Specialist, explains, "Over 97% of meadows have been destroyed in England since the 1930s. In many areas, rural road verges are the last remaining stretches of natural habitat for our wildlife. Road safety is the absolute priority, but we know

that verges can be remaining safe for some simple changes to cutting to allow seed to thrive".

Plantlife has produced urging the public to sign a adopt them. Some in Dorset, for example, the over-vigorous growth



managed better for wildlife whilst motorists. This means adopting management – like a delay in be set - so that wildflowers can

new management guidelines and is petition asking local councils to councils are leading the way. Trials are investigating how to combat of grass on fertile verges (which is

both detrimental to wildflowers and obscures driver sight-lines), by stripping turf, using semi-parasitic yellow rattle to stunt grass growth and even grazing verges with sheep. Plantlife is helping to showcase the work of councils like Dorset to show others that it can be done. Our guidelines are being currently being applied to 11,700 km of verge covering 2,300 hectares of verges — that's equivalent to 2.5 times the area of remaining upland hay meadow in the UK - and with the public's support we can do even more.

Dr Dines adds, "If we just give them a chance, wildflowers can return. Meadow crane's-bill was once widespread in meadows – hence its name – but is now more commonly found on road verges. It spreads readily when cutting is delayed and it's allowed to set seed. Maybe it's time to change its name to "verge crane's-bill".

AMBULANCE SERVICE SEEKS VOLUNTEER COMMUNITY RESPONDERS

South Central Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust has long subscribed to the fact that the quicker we can have a suitably trained person, with the appropriate equipment; to a member of the public during a life threatening emergency, the better the chance of survival and making a good recovery. A Few years ago we launched a charity division called "Community Responders", this initiative depends on members of the community volunteering within their local area to respond to emergencies giving lifesaving treatment prior to the ambulance arriving. Volunteers are given 2 full days of training at one of our training Centre's, explaining how to recognize and treat many life threatening medical emergencies, ranging from cardiac arrest to strokes in the elderly down to infants, to name but a few of the situations the volunteers may face. Once they have successfully completed the course they are supplied with an

Automated External Defibrillator. breathing equipment and a mobile phone. The volunteer responders can then respond, to an emergency in their local community and tend to the needs of the most vulnerable, whilst an ambulance is on route. Due to the close proximity of the volunteer responder to the emergency they are very often first on scene and their actions can directly affect the outcome of the patient, this will have an impact on the lives of the their family and friends within your community.

We are currently looking for volunteers to be a part of this lifesaving scheme to help within your community. Do you have a few hours a week to spare? No prior medical knowledge required as full training is given.


