COUNTY COUNCIL NEWS

Avril Davies County Councillor, Ivinghoe Division

Spurred on to achieve 10000 steps a day I've taken every chance over the summer to enjoy long walks in the Ivinghoe Hills, Ashridge Forest and on the Grand Union Canal. A regular Active Bucks walk from the Ivinghoe old school started in late August to motivate more people to get the benefits of exercise with companionship and encouragement. At the moment these are on Mondays at 10am from The Hub. More walks are planned as more leaders have come forward. Thank you.

Road repairs: Recently with the Local Area Technician I reviewed progress on the repair and maintenance programme for our local roads in preparation of putting forward priorities for the next financial year.

Weight limit on B488: I'm continuing to campaign for a weight limit on the B488 in response to a scheme of weight limits in

neighbouring Hertfordshire and Bedfordshire confining heavy lorries to the M1, A4146 Leighton Buzzard bypass, and the A505 after the completion of the M1 link north of Dunstable. Vehicles using the B488 at the bridge will be counted in October (not in half term) as the first stage necessary to impose a weight limit. After I met with the deputy cabinet member for transportation the urgent necessity of county wide weight limits and strategic HGV routes has been given higher priority and will feature at the next Transport for Bucks inhouse conference.

Primary school places: The provision of sufficient primary school places locally is now a concern to many, given the number of new homes proposed in the Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan. I have had several meetings Bucks County Council planners and school place planners to make them aware that schools are full in this area, and Buckinghamshire has said to the Pitstone NDP that it has no plans to increase their capacity, to see what can be done. School transport: There may also be changes to entitlement to free school travel for secondary school pupils next year, 2017, depending on the outcome of this summer's consultation. The proposals did not look easy to understand for this area, and all options for free travel would involve applying to out of county schools including those in Bedfordshire, as in many places they are the nearest schools. No decision has been made yet. Can I remind parents of older pupils in the sixth form already paying heavy transport fares, that Arriva offer a termly pass at a lot less than the County Council, which can be used on any bus on the route. The bus timetable has to be carefully studied before buying one of these. Currently in term time the 61 leaves lvinghoe around 07.15am and returns from Aylesbury at 15.55, although obviously there are later and earlier buses. Railways: The outcome of the WCML rail franchise consultation

has been published with only a small concession to station access and parking issues. Bucks County Council have had an apology for not being acknowledged as a contributor. I have also had some high level meetings at Bucks about the West Coast Main Line, to stress its importance to the economy, and how access to stations, and capacity in the trains, and limits to capacity on the line affect us. Recently axed Southern trains between Milton Keynes and East Croydon have now been restored to 5 a day.

Luton Airport will also be proposing changes to its aerospace this Autumn.

Council and local changes: The Parliamentary Boundary Commission has proposed that the whole

Ivinghoe Division, i.e. Ivinghoe ward and Pitstone and Cheddington wards, are moved out of the Buckingham Constituency and in to the Aylesbury Constituency. And as if all that change wasn't enough, BCC have submitted a proposal to the government for a single council for the county, with considerable revenue savings. They expect a decision by December. The Districts are also putting forward their set of proposals, which is likely to suggest two or even three councils.







DISTRICT COUNCIL NEWS

Sandra Jenkins & Derek Town, District Councillors, Pitstone & Cheddington Ward

VALP: The public consultation period closed on 5th September. Over 1500 individual responses have been received, but each of these contain several comments on different issues. At the moment the officers are collating these responses, which will then be passed to consultants to produce a summary report expected within 6 weeks. AVDC will need input from BCC on issues such as education and transport. The comments received will eventually be put on AVDC's website together with their replies. These comments will feed into the emerging planning policies and

eventual submission draft of VALP. This final draft will go to Cabinet and Scrutiny in December, and then to Council in January, for eventual submission to Government by March 2017 at the latest for an Examination in Public by a Planning Inspector by March 2017.

Duty to Cooperate: Meetings are continuing with our Duty to Cooperate partners. AVDC are working with the other Bucks Districts to ascertain their genuine unmet housing needs figure so that we can incorporate this in VALP. AVDC is also holding meetings with

Milton Keynes Council, Central Beds and Luton Borough Councils, as well as Dacorum, South Oxfordshire and South Northants Councils. East West Rail: This project has been delayed by HS2. Work is currently taking place between civil servants representing HS2 Ltd, Department for Transport and Network Rail on the HS2-East West Rail interface, and trying to reach a consensus is not easy. MPs are helping us trying to get things moving. On a more positive note, the planning application for a new station at Winslow has just been received by AVDC.

Community Chest: 2016-17 is the final year of the ten-year arrangement between the Vale of Aylesbury Housing Trust and Aylesbury Vale District Council to provide £5m of funding for voluntary and community sector projects in Aylesbury Vale. Since the fund launched, to the end of July 2016, 715 grants totalling £4,355,229 have been awarded for a huge variety of projects large and small across the Vale that will leave a lasting legacy. The final round of project grants (up to £25,000) closes on 2nd December 2016, with the final Grants Panel meeting scheduled for 9th January 2017. Microgrant applications (up to £1,000) will be accepted until 15th December, with monthly assessment by the grants officer using a scoring system. Please dispose of your garden waste responsibly Fly tipping includes dumping garden

waste anywhere, including in hedgerows, grass verges and woodlands. Just because it may eventually compost down, does not make dumping acceptable or permissible, the council is advised. This summer there has been a growing problem in Pitstone with garden waste and grass cuttings being dumped in numerous places throughout the village including: all along the field side of Vicarage Road, through the Byway Open to All Traffic between Queen Street and Grange Road, in the woodland at the end of Church Road and all through the woodland walk that runs between Castlemead and Vicarage Road.

As well as causing problems for the landowners where the material has been dumped (for xample preventing grass cutting and blocking drainage ditches), Thames Valley Police advise that dumping your waste in this manner is illegal and you could be fined and ordered to pay costs. Curbside weeds

Bucks County Council announced that there will be no routine weed spraying across Buckinghamshire during 2016-17 and hence the visible weed growth in the roadside gutters, roundabouts and islands.

They advise that while budget considerations have played a role in making this decision, there are 2 key influencing factors:

There is a detrimental environmental impact of the widespread use of herbicides on pollinating insects. The legal constraints that are now

imposed on the widespread use of herbicides significantly reduces the effectiveness of the application. Transport for Bucks will continue to treat noxious and injurious weeds in line with its legal obligations. To report these concerns go to www.buckscc.gov.uk/telltfb. In the meantime, the parish council is exploring other options. Residents are able, like in the old days, to remove the weeds from the curbside outside their properties by hand if they take sufficient care when



working by the highway, however Transport for Bucks confirm that the widespread use of common domestic weed killers is not permitted so please do not apply weed killer. Thank you to PRS Office Furniture

THE ICKNELD WAY ASSOCIATION

The Icknield Way is unique among long distance trails because it can claim to be 'the oldest road in Britain'. It consists of prehistoric pathways, ancient when the Romans came. The route is dotted with archaeological remains. It survives today in splendid tracks and green lanes along the 'chalk spine' of southern England and runs for 110 miles (177 km) from the end of the Ridgeway Path at Ivinghoe Beacon in Buckinghamshire, to the start of the Peddars Way at Knettishall Heath in Suffolk.

The Icknield Way Association has aimed to find the most pleasant route for walking, as close as possible to the line of the ancient Icknield Way and the route has been followed by thousands of walkers since its inception in 1984. Voluntary wardens monitor the path on behalf of the Association so that our Guide to the path can always be kept up to date. Our website www.icknieldwaypath.co.uk has a wealth of information and our Guidebook, now in its 6th edition, is also available from our website.

Changes to Redline Bus 164

Redline tell us that these changes are designed, to match the timetable with the amount of travel actually being made, so that the bus company can develop the better-used sections of route and secure its long term future.

The new route will be Marsworth, Cheddington, Long Marston, Wilstone, Tring, Aston Clinton, Aylesbury.

The biggest change is that the section of route between Cheddington & Leighton Buzzard is withdrawn.

The Red Kite Tuesday (market day) 167 bus will still run to Leighton Buzzard as will the Monday - Friday Service 162.

A new school timed journey is introduced which will give a direct service into the Aylesbury Schools Coach Park. This means that the 07:24 & 08:45 peak time arrivals in

WHAT'S GOING ON AT COLLEGE LAKE?

Leo Keedy, College Lake Warden

As summer moves towards autumn, there is a noticeable change around the reserve. The first signs of autumn colour are showing in the trees and hedgerows. A lot of the summer migrant birds have finished breeding and will be butterfly which comes over from the continent. These beautiful butterflies have golden yellow upper-wings, which are noticeable while in flight. When at rest, it sits with its wings closed, showing green-yellow

to arrive, with the odd snipe and wintering wildfowl such as Pochard and Teal being seen on the reserve. This transitional period often seems like a quiet time of year but with our mix of habitats there is always something to see out on the reserve. Recently we have had a good number of Clouded Yellow butterflies, one of the migrant species of

Lake – cutting the islands. The three islands are an important breeding site for many ground nesting birds and we have to manage the habitat to create suitable breeding

grounds for the birds' return, next spring. We aim to have close cut vegetation over most of the island but leave tussocks of grass and rushes for nesting and shelter. Each year Lapwing, Redshank, Little Ringed Plover, Oystercatcher and Common Tern breed on are faced with to cut and clear the vegetation. For several weeks our work

the islands, each of which prefer slightly different conditions. The Lapwing like very short vegetation as the tiny chicks will leave the nest on the day they hatch to catch their own food. Redshank tend to nest in the base of tussocks and while the adults are noticeable with their



parties are ferried out by boat to cut the grass and scrub with brush cutters and loppers, and then all the material is raked up and removed to prevent nutrient build up which would encourage more vigorous growth. Due to the

evocative sound while flying between the islands, quite often the first we know of successful breeding is when the fluffy chicks break cover. The Little Ringed Plovers nest **on the gravel and stones near to the water's** edge, they are incredibly well camouflaged both as eggs and once hatched. The islands may not seem all that big when observed from the trails and hides, but it is **once you're out there and standing on them,** that you realise the logistics of the task you cuttings, the only option is to throw them into the water. This works well as it has little or no effect on the water and even provides food and shelter for wildfowl.
