

COUNTY COUNCIL NEWS

Avril Davies County Councillor, Ivinghoe Division

It was great to see the replica fossil display restored at the College Lake centre in time for the Fantastic Fossils weekend at the beginning of April. Fossils from the Jurassic beds excavated at College Lake, which is designated a Site of Special Scientific Interest, are normally in storage at the Bucks County Museum Resource Centre at Halton, I have visited the Resource Centre twice recently as a member of the Select Committee for Transport, **Environment and Communities.** which maintains an overview of the Museum Trust.

The centre is open to the public by appointment. College Lake is also a

new venue for Active Bucks 'Simply Walk' on Wednesdays at 10.15 and I have enjoyed a walk with the group on a couple of occasions.

Since the new year, I have been a member of Health and Social Care, looking to understand the NHS strategic and transformation plans for Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and Berkshire, to be implemented in the next few years.

The Transport Environment and Communities Select Committee of which I am also a member, has been looking at school travel planning across the County to see how the council can build on its record of

reducing pupil journeys to school from 56% fifteen years ago to 26% now, and how this can be maintained with fewer resources than ever.

Work continues on school place planning in the lyinghoe Division. Dagnall Church of England school is currently consulting on becoming a combined school taking pupils up to

the age of II, which is one of many measures in discussion to provide more places. Residents will be receiving a small increase in their council tax bills this year. Unwelcome and inequitable as it is, there is no other way

to pay for public services. By 2020 there will be no top up grant from government and we don't know how the additional funds announced in the budget for adult social care will be distributed, although I don't expect good news for Bucks and other counties.

About two thirds of the county council's £350 million budget is spent on social care. Half of this

year's council tax increase will go into services for adults which supports increasing numbers of older people and adults with learning disabilities.

By 2020 all County Council funding will be from council tax and possibly a small amount from

possibly a small amount from business rates and none from government. Since 2010 the council has cut its budget by £100 million and is required to make further

savings of about £30 million.

This leaves very little spare for roads and all other services such as public health, planning, environment and education.

In the lyinghoe division last year 12 local road repair schemes from

Ledburn to Dagnall were completed. Work done ranged from patching to complete resurfacing, but there is still a list of urgent work, while other roads deteriorate as fast as repairs catch up. This is replicated across the county perceived in a recent survey as having the worst roads in Britain, not to mention some of the heaviest traffic.

The Dunstable North bypass is due to open in two phases in February and March, and the A4146 through Water End to Leighton Buzzard downgraded to B road status.

This corner of the County is particularly affected by HGVs finding alternatives to the A5 and MI to reach the A4I and M25. Without comprehensive signage keeping heavy goods and other through traffic on the motorway and bypasses this could get

worse. The three counties of Beds. **Bucks and Herts** met recently to agree the new signage, but I am still waiting to get sight of it to pass on to the parish councils concerned.

The B488 is the only north-south road not to have a proposed weight limit, although a traffic count has already taken place to measure the number of HGVs using the route, and another is planned after the new bypass is open. If HGV numbers increase our case for a weight limit will be be finalised in 2018. strengthened.

After many years of inaction, a launch meeting was set up in February to revive the county wide freight strategy. The Beacon Freight Quality Partnership set up by the Great Brickhill, Wing and Ivinghoe Local Area Forum a few years ago was unable to progress further without a county wide strategy for HGV routes being further developed and promoted to improve routes through and within the county and minimise

> the impact on communities. In February a workshop for parish, district and county councillors, highways and planning staff, and representatives of the freight

industry, met to define the key issues that affect local communities, to be taken into account in the County Council freight strategy. Discussions included matters such as noise, road safety, damage to roads, lorry routing and congestion. The new strategy is expected to

DISTRICT COUNCIL NEWS

Sandra Jenkins & Derek Town, District Councillors, Pitstone & Cheddington Ward

It's all about waste this month, some good news and some not so!

Good news on recycling in AVDC

Recycling remains between 50% and 55%. Service quality is excellent with missed bins now around 180 a month compared with 900 a month last year; with 75,000 residents in the Vale, that means a total of 300,000 bins collected each month (not including garden or food waste bins), so the percentage on 180 is minute. The improvement partly arises from the crews now being more familiar with their routes, following the reorganisation of routes after the

opening of the Greatmoor EfW (Energy from Waste facility near Grendon Underwood near the existing Calvert landfill which is almost full up).

Food recycling in the district has now reached 58% which is extremely satisfactory compared with the national average of 30%.

Bulky waste remains very popular, especially in the rural areas, and is at full capacity on two days a week operations.

Garden Waste is increasing year on year and is now collected from 21,500 properties.

Waste Processing at Cheddington/Marsworth old airfield site

AVDC Planning Application Consultation 17/01064/ACC The item in italics below is an extract from AVDC Planning Enforcement bulletin for November 2016.

This was the subject of a significant appeal 10 years ago for a similar installation that was beyond the existing planning conditions for the Cheddington/Marsworth airfield site. The subsequent outcome was against the waste operator (not Waste King but the now defunct Cairns).

This application makes no reference to lorry movements per day or any local employment prospects. The previous application was refused and the subsequent appeal dismissed. Cheddington PC investigations to support the respective objections to this development identified significant possible

traffic movements made up of skip lorries and very large mineral trucks delivering waste from north London and beyond for processing.

16/00427/CON3 PITSTONE And CHEDDINGTON WARD

Alleged unauthorised:

- I) Installation of a Picking station/ trommel/screener
- 2) Storage of large amounts of waste
- 3) Skip lorries/cage vehicles entering site during 0630hrs-1900hrs 6 days a week including bank holidays
- 4) Waste equipment used everyday including Saturdays
 Waste King Limited Unit 25
 Marsworth Airfield North Site
 Cheddington Lane Marsworth
 Buckinghamshire

At present information is minimal but it does appear Waste King intend to establish a facility/hub to concentrate, process and re-distribute construction and demolition materials. The consequences of this could be experienced by local villages as an increase in

lorry movements across all roads and lanes; possibly airborne pollution as dust from the 'trommel' plant; potential water pollution to the brook that flows along the eastern site boundary (is this another problem for Thames Water?) The fact is, as we all are aware, the roads in this district were never built for such HGV traffic, the condition re potholes is confirmation already, to

lorry movements across all roads and what is expected to become worse.

Parish Councils are responding to Bucks County Council (BCC Ref CM/17/17 for Consultation) notification that came out in March. Additionally all residents need to monitor and if possible take note of lorries in and out of the site and using routes through villages where they ought not to be.



Housing

We would like to thank everyone who responded to the housing survey. The response rate was very low, but if you are in need of some housing advice, please see the recommendations below:

Shared Ownership

A number of the responses asked for more shared ownership properties to become available in the village. These properties are designed for people who can't afford to buy a home outright on the open market. The schemes are run by housing associations and you buy a % share in the house and rent the remainder of the property at a subsidised rate so

as to be affordable, you can then increase the percentage of the property that you 'buy' over time. We can confirm that a number of shared ownership homes will be included within the housing developments off Rushendon Furlong, Vicarage Road and around the Memorial Hall/village green and the parish council will be working with the developers and AVDC housing. They will predominantly be 2 and 3 bedroom houses (as I bedroom properties/flats are not affordable options under this model). All interested residents should register with HelpToBuyESE.org.uk as all shared ownership properties that become available have to be listed on this website, and you will then receive notification when properties that meet your criteria become available. Residents interested in the properties that will become available in the Rushendon Furlong development should also register their interest with Hightown Housing Association (www.hightownha.org.uk) as they have been appointed to run this particular scheme.

Rental via AVDC

The housing officer at AVDC confirms that anyone interested in renting a council property should complete the application form on the BucksHomeChoice.gov.uk website to determine if you are eligible. Even if you are over 18yrs and living in the parental home with your own bedroom, you may still be eligible under the 'shared accommodation' regulations, so AVDC encourage you to check. AVDC give priority to applicants from the 'East of Aylesbury' subgroup within which, Pitstone falls, but they are not able to grant a higher priority to existing Pitstone residents and the parish council has no ability to influence this. We can confirm that a number of rental properties will be included within the developments in Rushendon Furlong, Vicarage Road and around the Memorial Hall/village green, ranging from 1 & 2 bedroom flats up to 3 bedroom houses, and the parish council will work with the developers and AVDC housing for these schemes. We would therefore encourage you to register with Bucks Home Choice so that you are able to apply for these properties once they come on the market.

Charitable Flats

Pitstone Town Lands Charity currently operates 4 one bedroom flats in the village, which they offer for rental. All flats are currently occupied but you can register your interest by contacting the Town Lands Charity (Gill Lowe (Chair) 01296 668809).

The parish council will provide further updates as and when they are available.

Open Space by The Crescent You will recall that Bucks County Council expressed a desire to build residential properties on the public open space between Marsworth Road and The Crescent. This was strongly opposed by both residents and the parish council. As part of the Neighbourhood Development Plan process, we were able to designate the land as Local Green Space, prohibiting its use for residential development. We are now pleased to advise you that Bucks County Council has agreed to sell the land to the parish council so that it can be preserved for community benefit in perpetuity, and that Aylesbury Vale District Council has agreed to support this project with a grant of Section 106 funds which they hold for Pitstone arising

from the development of the Castlemead estate. Once the transaction has been completed, we will let you all know.

Best Kept Village Competition – everyone can help

The parish council will again be entering the above competition. The prize is awarded for the village that is best maintained and shows evidence of community involvement, it isn't an 'in bloom' competition. The frontages of properties, restaurants, shops, village halls etc all play their part, along with grass cutting, noticeboard information, church yards, open spaces, playgrounds etc. Judging takes place in June or July (we aren't notified of the date), so it would be wonderful if all residents could keep their frontages well maintained, pick up any litter you see (our litter pickers will also be out regularly, but can't be in every road every day) and generally help to keep our village clean, tidy and up-to-date.

Play areas

The equipment within our play areas is continuously under review and you will be aware that we still aspire to replace the recreation ground playground as soon as we can secure the necessary land. We try to provide a wide range of activities

across the three playgrounds, to suit a variety of age groups and abilities. Should you have a child with a particular disability or play need, please let us know so that we can take your requests into consideration within our long term play space planning. You can find our play space policy on our website.

Please remember that Fly Posting is a Criminal Offence

There has been a marked increase in the amount of posters and adverts fly -posted around the village. As a reminder, fly-posting is defined as "displaying adverts and other promotional materials without permission, on buildings, posts, poles, litter bins and elsewhere in public". Fly-posting is mainly done by businesses and community groups that want free advertising. However, before putting your local group or business at risk (especially as your contact details are likely to be on your poster!), you should also remember that fly-posting is illegal and measures to prevent fly-posting include:

On-the-spot fines of up to £80 Use of fixed penalty notices Prosecution in a magistrates' court Special powers to tackle Anti-Social Behaviour Charging the offender for the cost of removing the posters
Therefore, please refrain from littering our village in such a manner.
You should also be aware that advertising your event via temporary signs in the grass verges, or by the highway (eg on the recreation ground fence or by the sports pavilion) is

regulations. Anyone considering this should apply to the parish council for a permit (under powers devolved to the parish by Bucks County Council). Any signage that appears where a permit hasn't been sought will be removed.

also subject to strict highways

Re-development of the sports pavilion

The parish council currently has a planning application submitted for the installation of two sections of ballstop netting at the sports pavilion off Marsworth Road. The project to install the netting is also dependent upon external funding being secured, and grant applications to the relevant bodies are also in the course of being prepared. This will form part of the initial works to improve health & safety and cost efficiency at the site, expand the internal capacity to match our boundary and thus enable other development at the site, and extend the football pitch to meet league

requirements. Work is just beginning to look at options for re-designing/ expanding the building to enable a greater range of activities to take place and improving the parking, access and security etc. We will keep you updated as the projects progress.

Wild Orchids along Westfield Road

AVDC and BCC, along with TDS, have agreed to suspend grass cutting along 3 sections of Westfield Road this year to protect over 400 fledgling wild Bee Orchid plants. We are obviously privileged that such flora can thrive in the wild along our highways, as this is not common. By the time you receive this magazine, you will be able to see signs highlighting the areas (>200 plants on the bank in front of Safran, >100 plants on a strip of curbside verge between Tunnel Way and the 30mph sign and >100 plants on part of the central bank to the left of Warwick Road). We would anticipate that the orchids (last year saw Bee, Pyramidical and Spotted orchids) will flower in May/June and cutting will resume in July. This work supports the aspirations of the residents stated in the Neighbourhood Plan and complies with our duties to enhance biodiversity.



ALL CHANGE

'The pound won't be round much longer' is just one catchy headline about the arrival of the new twenty sided pound coin. The pound matters because money is so central to our lives and is a symbol of national identity and wealth. I will miss those words inscribed into the bevelled edge. 'DECUS ET TUTAMEN', which first appeared on coins in the seventeenth century to prevent precious metal from being clipped away. Today the inscription makes the coin more difficult to forge. Until recent centuries however, the value of the metal in the coin corresponded to the value of the coin so you didn't want any shaved away by unscrupulous dealers.

Paper money was (and is) little more than an IOU from a trusted source. Our notes and coins work because we trust that they have a value other than the value of the metal used to make the token.

The intricate design of the new pound coin is intended to promote confidence that each is genuine. However there is a deeper level of

confidence needed in our money. We need to trust the source, the Bank of England. There are many examples of governments printing money, genuine money, but worthless money because so much of it has been issued.

This underlying belief in the source is actually faith. Religion is what we see and experience. How, where and when we worship are important and we are uneasy about change. However at a deeper level, underneath our religious activity is faith, faith in God. If we get below the surface, instead of seeming strange or archaic we will discover that faith is life changing. It is an opening, to be as bright and shiny as one of those twenty-sided coins.


