- The Trustees maintain a list of eligible couples and individuals and deliver the grants as cheques annually.

The Williamson Trust takes its name from Mark Williamson who donated £10,000 following the sale of land to develop Crispin Field. A further bequest of £93,000 was made to the charity following the death of his son, Humphrey Williamson, in 2009. The Charity has invested donations from the Williamson family and uses the interest from these funds to make grants.
