Last two public access defibrillators now live

We are pleased to advise that the last two public access defibrillators have now been installed and registered to The Circuit so the information is available to ambulance crews. These units are located:

- near the play area in Windsor Road (likely to be your nearest unit if you reside near the middle of Castlemead or by The Pightle) and
- by the open space at the far right hand end of Crispin Field (likely to be your nearest unit if you live in Crispin Field, Chequers Close or that end of Cheddington Road)

The ambulance operator will direct you to your nearest unit if they feel a defibrillator is required, and provide you with the access code for the cabinet. The bright yellow cabinets are mounted to lamp posts in these two locations so are easily visible. Our grateful thanks to the Pitstone Town Lands Charity for their generous donation which facilitated the purchase and installation of these last two units.

24/7 Public Access Defibrillators are currently located at:

- Pitstone Pavilion
- Pitstone Memorial Hall
- The Village Health Centre in Yardley Avenue
- The Lounge in Yardley Avenue
- Cooks Wharf Marina
- Colbree Engineering Group, Beacon Court
- Little Rothschild House Surgery, Marsworth Road
- 1 Meadow Lane
- By the play area in Windsor Road
- By the open space at the far right hand end of Crispin Field, near the alleyway through to Cheddington Road



There is also a defibrillator at Sapphire Gymnastics, during opening hours only

Replacement Slide for Windsor Road



We are pleased to confirm that Buckinghamshire Council has now approved a release of £7k S106 developer contribution funding towards the cost of a replacement slide for the Windsor Road playground (the existing slide being beyond economic repair due to rusting legs). They have also now approved the supplier (Creative Play) and design (Bespoke Jigsaw Tower), see the illustration.

The site survey is taking place during January and Creative Play hope to commence work in February. We will keep you posted via our website and social media channels.

Improvements at the Pavilion

The Parish Council is working jointly with Pitstone & Ivinghoe United Football Club to install a pitch barrier around the senior pitch with mesh infill panels, which will allow advertising signs to be erected, creating a new advertising opportunity and revenue stream to help fund the ongoing pitch care. We will let you know via our website and social media channels as soon as the advertising opportunities go live.

Ivinghoe & Pitstone Safety Scheme

Buckinghamshire Council has advised that they have some highway maintenance issues to resolve before they can progress with any elements of the safety scheme along the section of Marsworth Road between Westfield Road and the roundabout. We continue to explore options and timelines with them for these works.

New website and email addresses

The Parish Council is moving to a dedicated .gov website platform, which should be live during the next couple of months, and will enable us to have greater control and flexibility over the presentation of the Parish Council material and services, which you will hopefully find easier to navigate. The existing village website is likely to remain live, so you will still be able to use this to find local class and event information etc.

As part of the move, the Council email addresses will be updated. We'll provide you with all the new details, and set up a forwarding service for a while.

Does your community group need financial assistance?

The Parish Council offers grants to local community groups and local charities that specifically benefit Pitstone residents. Applications are considered quarterly. Our most recent recipient was 1st Ivinghoe and Pitstone Scouts for replacement tents, which they are using for a camping trip this February. Planning

Although Buckinghamshire Council has produced a draft of its new, county-wide, Local Plan in which it acknowledges the challenge of meeting substantially increased housing targets, there is no direct indication in the draft of how Pitstone or surrounding villages might be affected. The Parish Council is contacting Bucks to see if it is prepared to give us more detail and is doing some feasibility work to assess whether a review of our own current Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) would strengthen our say in any future local development proposals.

THE WHISTLE BROOK

Councillor Dave Frearson

We are all fortunate enough to live in a green and pleasant land. We are on the fringes of chalk hills, surrounded by farmland and close to ancient woods.

The babbling brook is an integral part of this landscape. Locally, the most significant of these is the Whistle Brook, which in our immediate area is the boundary between the parishes of Pitstone and Ivinghoe. Further downstream, it runs through Slapton Parish and ultimately into the River Ouse. It lends its name to our local school, powers the Watermill, we walk beside it, cross it, play in it and many use it for trout fishing.

The Whistle Brook is particularly special as it is a Chalk Stream. Chalk Streams are recognised internationally as being ecologically important habitats by organisations such as the WWF. They are also rare, with only around 250 recognised globally. 80% of them are in England. So the Whistle Brook is not just locally important, it is internationally important.

Unfortunately, we English have not been looking after our Chalk Streams well and they are generally in a poor state in this country. Something that has often been highlighted nationally on programs like Countryfile. A recent housing development plan submitted to Bucks Council indicated the ecology of the Whistle Brook would be reduced, but there are many other local threats. As such, we are not immune to the harm being caused to them. Governmental and regional organisations have developed plans to improve them, such as DEFRA and the Chiltern Society, so there are plans to

turn this around.

The first stage to managing, protecting and improving any habitat is to determine what its current condition is. This is something that we have discussed at Pitstone Parish Council and I have subsequently attended meetings at Ivinghoe and Slapton Parish Councils to discuss this further. The idea is to establish a group of volunteers to start regularly monitoring the streams water quality. The simplest way to do this is to carry out regular kick sampling surveys down the length of the Whistle Brook. The data will then be fed into a national data base so it can be monitored. A model that has been followed successfully for many years elsewhere such as along the Ver in St. Albans.

This will require a group of us locals to do this and we estimate something between 8-12 across the three Parishes would be ideal. We have already had quite a few offers, but yes, this is a shout out to anyone interested in getting involved. We will need to work in pairs, with each pair covering two or three locations on a monthly basis. We have identified an organisation that will provide training and equipment. So if this is something you think you would be interested in getting involved with or know someone who would, please get in contact. The next stage is for that group to meet to discuss the idea, convert it into a plan and then into action; it has been suggested by one of the Slapton Parish Councillors this is at the Rose and Crown if that helps to persuade you...

BUCKS COUNTY NEWS

Councillor Chris Poll

It has been a very busy 7 months since the elections in May, and we have quickly settled into the new Council term. Peter [Brazier] having been appointed as a Cabinet member, for Culture and Leisure, and myself [Chris Poll] as Chairman of the Community Board. Besides these roles, there are the day-to-day **tasks of answering residents' enquiries and** attending meetings in Aylesbury and elsewhere as required. I shall be attending the Budget Scrutiny Committee for the whole of the second week of January: more background to which can be found in the following paragraphs. It does not make for happy reading, I am sorry to say. Central Government has pushed Local Government budgets for years, and despite what some may say, this year is no exception. In Buckinghamshire, we are facing unprecedented financial pressures. The central government's recent Fair Funding Review means we face a reduction in funding in real terms.

Budget.

The settlement for local authorities was announced in the middle of December and, as expected, Buckinghamshire has suffered a reduction in funding. The forecast figure was an anticipated cut of £42.5 million over the financial settlement period. This was made more difficult given the lack of clarity provided by Government, but it proved to be broadly correct – the actual figure is a reduction in funding of £44.5 million.

As costs rise and the demand for statutory services like adult social care and special educational needs support for children continue to grow, currently approximately 73% of our entire budget, we need to make some very difficult decisions in relation to spending.

Following the public consultation we ran last



autumn, we have now developed a draft budget for 2026-27. This will go before our Budget Scrutiny Inquiry Task and Finish Group in mid-January.

This is obviously unwelcome news and the further £2 million reduction from the forecast serves to place even greater pressure on our finances. Government have **claimed that the “Core funding power” for Bucks has been INCREASED by 14.1%.** This is completely misleading. The actual measure **should be called “Core Spending Power” (CSP) which relates to the non-ringfenced money available to this Council....** Including the INCREASES in Council Tax that **the “Fair Funding” formula forces us to** account for.

The actual increase in CSP, including the rises in Council Tax for the 3-year settlement period is 8.1%. The average across England is an increase of 15.1%. So Bucks, even with a 5% per annum Council Tax increase, only sees half the Core Spending Power gain as the rest of England. This figure does NOT account for inflation – so the reality is that the small CSP increase will largely be inflated away and yet the demand for services continues to rise. Without the increases to Council Tax there would be an overall REDUCTION in CSP of approx. 5%, worth around £30m.

The Government is claiming this is a 14.1% increase because, inexplicably, they have chosen to use LAST YEAR as their baseline comparison and not this current year!

The headline message is that Buckinghamshire residents will see increases

in Council Tax and money will be sent to other parts of the country, overall Bucks will have £44.5 million less as a county.

There is, however, some good news within our own budget. There has been an increase in the expansion of our Council Tax base. This has provided additional resources into the budget which means fewer cuts will need to be made than previously assumed.

As a result, the budget proposals have **been changed to 'buy back' some options**, a number of which are relatively minor and non-resident focused but the key resident ones are.

Therefore, we will retain weekly frequency of bin collections, the increases in road and transport investment, the retention of all Household Recycling Centres and keeping public toilets open!

Other Councils in the country are squeezing these areas and making cuts or changes to services. Despite the targeted attack on rural county and unitary authorities by the Government, a history of strong, sound and prudent control of our budgets in Buckinghamshire has meant we can adjust to provide a balanced budget.

The reality is that Government are also reducing grants and investment in other areas – such as the cancellation of the previously promised SEND school. Plus, we also do not yet know what the SEND reforms will result in. The fact is that the funding provided is not sustainable over the long term.

I am sorry to be the bearer of such news but this is the reality every year when funding announcements are made.

Buckinghamshire housing plan.

The initial proposals for the new Buckinghamshire wide housing plan will be announced soon. With Government seeking 1.5 million homes to be built in this Parliament it is inevitable that we will see large scale development in Bucks. Where these will be proposed is not yet clear but we will expect to take our share within the ward. It is simply not possible to accommodate all of this in small sites or infill, there will inevitably be new larger developments. I have always said that the arbitrary figure announced within their manifesto would be impossible to deliver. It now seems that statistics are showing this to be the case. Current projections are that between 700 and 800,000 could be built. There may well be 1.5 million permissions given but finances and the skilled workforce are just not there to enable delivery.

Finally

As always, we attend almost every Parish Council meeting throughout the year, unless a meeting at Bucks Council clashes, where we can be approached by residents or we welcome any communication by email at any time.

Once again, we wish you a very happy and prosperous 2026.

Pitstone Step-Up Grants

Apply by
27 February 2026 !

As part of the last round of Pitstone Step-Up Grants, the Charity were delighted to provide funding for one resident to attend sign language training, supported by an interpreter; one young man to receive a bus pass to attend further education along with some necessary PPE for his course; an applicant to receive funding to access train travel to attend a Masters course in London; one young lady to receive partial funding towards university accommodation and a young person received funding to join the Buckinghamshire Youth Orchestra and receive further musical tuition. The total value of the funds granted exceeded £8k!

Applications for the next round need to be submitted by 27 February 2026. You will need to attend an interview in support of your application on the evening of Thursday 19 March 2026. You will receive notification of any grant offered within ten days. As applications are only considered quarterly, we encourage you to think ahead and apply early.

Pitstone Step-Up Grants are new grants available to Pitstone residents, funded from income from a local charity*. They are designed to relieve hardship, need or distress by enabling the long-term transformation of the recipient's quality of life in some way. This could be through removing barriers to enable an individual to pursue a life-improving opportunity that would otherwise have been

unaffordable, or to complete some form of training or upskilling that will demonstrably improve their professional or earning potential, where funding is not available from another source.


